Literacy

Improving literacy outcomes for learners

- Improving our delivery of literacy across the school, ensuring the needs of all learners are met
- Assessment, using 3 Minute Reading Assessment, listening and talking assessment and writing assessment used to identify gaps in learning early and ensure progress
- Writing Intervention, Vowel House and Colourful Consonants, Read, Write, Inc, Black Sheep Press and Teaching Children to Listen all used in a targeted way with P1 - P7 learners, as appropriate

Numeracy

Improving numeracy outcomes for learners

- Improving our delivery of numeracy and maths across the school, ensuring that the needs of all learners are met
- Assessment, using a resource called Sandwell, to identify gaps in learning early and ensure progress
- Building Fact Fluency used in P1 as an early intervention approach to teaching numeracy
- Building Fact Fluency in a targeted way with P2 & P3
- Numicon intervention in a targeted way with P4 - P7 learners

Health & Wellbeing

Improving health and wellbeing outcomes for learners

- Improving our delivery of health and wellbeing across the school, ensuring that the needs of all learners are met
- Lego Therapy Group used in a targeted way develop confidence and engagement
- Wider experiences, including Passion Projects, Social Enterprise, My Primary, Judo and outdoor learning to ensure opportunities for all learners
- Employment of an Active Schools Modern Apprentice to provide additional experiences in a targeted way.

Other

Ensuring equity

- Employment of a Pupil Equity Funding Principal Teacher, with responsibility for interventions and ensuring progress for all targeted learners
- A focused approach to improving attendance for targeted pupils
- Life skills curriculum for those learners who require a unique way to learner
